


Infographic Elements Social Impacts of Labour Mobility

nuclear and extended family supported financially

Build and renovate house

Women raising their children single handedly is a challenge as at times; children tend to misbehave in the absence of their fathers. Mothers have had to play a dual role and at times they can't play both roles

Family and Vanua Obligations – this includes looking after the plantation and contributing to traditional obligations. To mitigate this, they had to pay youths to look after their plantation. Another challenge is there are few youths left to do the communal activities.

Increase in business investments

Support education of children

Lack of support/no one looking after parents/plantation/changes felt during funeral gatherings/absence felt in the family

Family separation weakens relationship between husband and wife, brings about loneliness, minimal to no contact between worker and spouse resulting in separation and divorce.








